Dear Parents and Carers.

We have had a lovely start to our new session. We have welcomed our new Primary 1 children and their parents and they are settling well into our St Helen's family. We have enjoyed some lovely weather giving everyone an opportunity to get out and play together. We look forward to an exciting year of learning, fun and friendship.

This is our first full monthly newsletter of the session and as such there is a lot of information and reminders included in it. My apologies for its extended length but it is important to share this information to ensure the wellbeing and safety of our children and whole community.

Arrangements for session 2023-24

Thank you for your continued support and cooperation as we have been settling back into school routines. The children have adapted well to the morning routine helped by the 'get ready' bell at 8.57am which lets them get to the class line ready to get into class at 9am. Thank you parents and carers for moving to the back of the yard at this time to allow the Class Teachers a clear view of the children as they

organise them and move into school. It is fabulous to see our children from Primary 1-7 socialising with each other in the playground before school!

One important matter - can I please ask that you do not bring your child into school by the main driveway as this is a busy area with cars and no pedestrian path. Please use the Gates at Wester Cleddens Rd and Pentland Drive.

If you are coming into school late or at any other time you would use the main drive to access the school office and main entrance. Thank you.

School Uniform and PE Days

Thank you so much for your continued support of the school uniform. The children all look so smart and proudly wearing their uniform. The school uniform helps to develop a sense of community and promotes inclusion as well as removing the peer pressure for expensive branded items. The children should wear their full school uniform on the 3 days that they do not have Physical Education.

PE days have now been set and the children should wear their PE uniform to school on those 2 days only.

On PE days can I ask you to please remove all jewellery before coming to school, in particular earrings. East Dunbartonshire Council policy does not allow jewellery to be worn or earrings to be covered with tape during PE.



Also, can I remind you to write/put your child's name on all items of clothing and bags. It is often a good idea to personalise blazers and school waterproofs with a badge or key ring on the zip also. It is almost impossible to find/return lost items when there is no name on them and it can be expensive to replace

these items. We are already gathering quite a lot of lost property that cannot be identified as there are no names on them.

Health and Safety

Water in school

Can I remind you that children are not allowed cans or glass bottles in school. We do encourage all children to bring a refillable water bottle to use in class. During class time children can become thirsty which can affect their concentration thus it is advised that each child brings a bottle of plain water to school which can be replenished throughout the day. They can have a flavoured drink or milk as part of their lunch/packed lunch but it should not be a fizzy, sugary or energy drink. Thank you





<u>Allergies</u>

Several children in the school suffer from various allergies. Can I ask that you support us in keeping them safe by not giving your children anything that contains

nuts such as peanut butter and chocolate nut spread. The school needs to be a nut-free zone. Thank you for your co-operation in this important matter.

Parking in and around the school

Parking is a difficulty at the school. Can I remind you that the parking spaces at the flats at Palmer Court are private. Please avoid parking in this area and park responsibly with consideration for our neighbours.



Parents are welcome to park at the car park at **St Dominic's Church** and walk the short distance into school.

Very importantly - No cars are allowed to park in the school car parks except where there are <u>notified medical reasons and you are displaying a Blue Badge (Disability).</u>

In such cases you should contact Mrs O'Connor to make this arrangement.

Furthermore, we ask that you <u>do not stop</u> or <u>turn at the entrance/gate</u> to the school as this causes congestion and endangers our staff and children.

Head Lice



Head lice can be a constant problem in schools. It is advisable to routinely check your children's hair each week. Please also let the school know so that we can be aware of any outbreak. Thank you.

Media Devices

Does your child have a mobile phone, smart watch or games console? The following website will help you to set up parental controls which can help avoid unsuitable content being accessed by your child, no matter their age, www.internetmatters.org. has a list of all the latest devices, how to set them up and is easy to follow.

Can I also ask you to remind your children that if they have a mobile phone at school it must remain switched off and in their bags while on school premises- including in the school yard- throughout the day. Furthermore, Smart watches should absolutely not be used for calls, messaging or photographs within school. Thank you.
